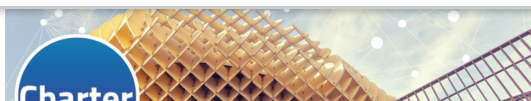


Save the date for a 1-day CHARTER conference in Rome on 30 November
